



October 9, 2012, is the DEADLINE to Register To Vote in the November 6, 2012, General and Special Election

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER TO VOTE IF:

- You are a United States citizen;
- You are a resident of the county where you submit the application;
- You are at least 18 years old on Election Day;
- You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole); and

YOU HAVE NOT BEEN DECLARED BY A COURT EXERCISING PROBATE JURISDICTION TO BE EITHER TOTALLY MENTALLY INCAPACITATED OR PARTIALLY MENTALLY INCAPACITATED WITHOUT THE RIGHT TO VOTE.

Simply pick up a voter registration application, fill it out and mail it no later than October 9, 2012 (MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN, 10-9-12).

Are you already registered?

To confirm your voter registration status, you may select one of three methods to perform a search:

- Your Texas driver's license number, if you provided it when you applied for voter registration;
- Your Voter Unique Identifier (VUID), which appears on your voter registration certificate;
- Your first and last name.

You can register in person at your county [Voter Registrar's office](#). Or you can register by mail by obtaining an application from your county [Voter Registrar's office](#) or the [Secretary of State's office](#). You can also pick up applications at libraries, government offices, or high schools.

Filling out the Application

All voters who register to vote in Texas must provide a Texas driver's license number or personal identification number issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety. If you don't have such a number, simply provide the last four digits of your social security number. If you don't have a social security number, you need to state that fact.
