Collin County Texas Film Round-up

What kind of films and videos qualify for free digitization?

Films and videos (including home movies) that are:

- filmed **in** Texas
- filmed **by** a Texan, or
- **feature** Texas or Texans

What formats can be digitized?

How do I submit my films and/or videos?

Gather your items together, label each one with your name, and turn them in at the Texas Film Round-up event in McKinney, July 14, or at an early drop-off location. (Volunteers will help you with your items and paperwork.) You can submit up to 50 films, 20 videos, or a combination of 30 films and videos per household.

Where are the early drop-off locations?

From July 1–12, you can drop off your films at the Allen Arts Alliance or at one of the following Collin County libraries: Celina, Farmersville, Frisco, Melissa, Plano Haggard Library, Princeton, Prosper, and Wylie.

What happens to my films and/or videos?

Your original materials are mailed back to you along with your choice of an .avi file or a DVD. This process takes about three months.

TAMI keeps a digital copy of your films and videos for preservation and research purposes. About 10% of the films and videos are placed online at the TAMI web site: www.texasarchive.org. In addition, a copy of Collin County-related videos will be donated to local archives.
