The S.C.O.R.E. program is a state-funded Intermediate Sanctions Facility (ISF) operated jointly by the Collin County Community Supervision & Corrections Department and the Collin County Sheriff's Office. Our program is designed to help participants with cognitive behavioral change, developing work ethic, and promoting a structured lifestyle.
