STANDING ORDER REGARDING PROPOSED JURY CHARGES

To ensure the efficient administration of Jury Trials, the Court enters the following Standing Order applicable to all cases set for Jury Trial.

1. Conference Regarding Jury Charge

No later than fourteen (14) days after a case is set for Jury Trial, counsel for all parties shall confer in a good faith effort to prepare and agree upon a proposed Jury Charge.

2. Agreed Proposed Jury Charge

If the parties reach agreement on the proposed Jury Charge, the agreed charge shall be submitted to the Court no later than the arraignment/pretrial conference, unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

3. Disputed Jury Charge

If the parties are unable to agree on a proposed Jury Charge, each party shall submit its own proposed written Jury Charge, together with any requested questions, instructions, definitions, and objections, no later than the arraignment/pretrial conference.

4. Modification of Jury Charge

Any proposed Jury Charge submitted pursuant to this Order remains subject to correction, amendment, or modification by the Court at any time prior to its submission to the Jury.

5. Failure to Comply

Failure to timely submit a proposed Jury Charge as required by this Standing Order may result in the case being removed from the Jury Trial Docket and continued.
