MENTAL HEALTH

Collin County offers mental health services through both of our medical plans with a \$15 copay, whether your provider is in-network or out-of-network. If you see an out-of-network provider, you'll need to pay upfront and then submit a claim for reimbursement at myuhc.com.

On myuhc.com, you can search for behavioral and mental health providers, access virtual visit options, and find self-help resources when you need them.

Law Enforcement Mental Health Program

Collin County provides a mental health program exclusively for our law enforcement employees. This benefit offers confidential guidance and counseling at no cost to you, with Collin County covering 100% of the fees.

We recognize the unique pressures law enforcement professionals face, and this program is designed to support your well-being.

Services are available through FIRST, which includes a network of 45 mental health professionals across Texas and Oklahoma who are experienced in supporting first responders. FIRST can connect you with a provider based on your needs. One of the clinicians in this network, Dena Williams, has previously worked with Collin County employees and can also be contacted directly.
