

NOTICE OF BOUNDARY CHANGES TO VOTING PRECINCTS

In October 2021, Governor Abbott signed into law the new U.S. Congressional, Texas House, Texas Senate and State Board of Education maps based on the 2020 Census. In November 2021, Collin County Commissioners also approved new Commissioner and Constable/Justice of the Peace districts. On December 6, 2021, the Commissioners Court of Collin County, Texas adopted changes to the boundaries of the following voting precincts. Maps depicting the boundaries of the new precincts may be viewed at www.collincountytx.gov/elections. These changes will be effective January 1, 2022.

- 013: Precinct 13 will be split north to south along the natural boundary of Wilson Creek from County Road 88 to E. FM 1461 (E. Frontier Pkwy.) forming a new precinct, Precinct 240. Precinct 240 will be located to the west of the split. The current Precinct 13 will remain to the east of the split.
- 025: Precinct 25 will be split north to south along N. Murphy Rd. and west to east from Heritage Pkwy. to N. Murphy Rd. along Glen Ridge Dr. forming a new precinct, Precinct 241. Precinct 241 will be located to the south and east of the split. The current Precinct 25 will remain to the north and west of the split.
- 026: Precinct 26 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The areas of Precinct 26 that were split by the proposed Congressional lines were merged with Precinct 138 to the west to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 028: Precinct 28 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 28 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines was merged with Precinct 75 to the west to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 038: Precinct 38 will be split north to south starting along Alma Rd. then continuing along the natural boundary of Rowlett Creek forming a new precinct, Precinct 242. Precinct 242 will be located to the west of the split. The current Precinct 38 will remain to the east of the split.
- 041: Precinct 41 will be split north to south along FM 1378 (Southview Dr.) forming a new precinct, Precinct 243. Precinct 243 will be located to the west of the split. The current Precinct 41 will remain to the east of the split.
- 050: Precinct 50 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 50 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines was merged with Precinct 82 to the north to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 053: Precinct 53 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 53 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines was merged with Precinct 70 to the south to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 062: Precinct 62 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 62 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines was merged with Precinct 63 to the west to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 087: Precinct 87 will be split north to south along Independence Pkwy. forming a new precinct, Precinct 244. Precinct 244 will be located to the east of the split. The current Precinct 87 will remain to the west of the split.
- 093: Precinct 93 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 93 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines became a new precinct, Precinct 201. The "Precinct 201" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved. The new Precinct 201 could not be combined with Precinct 93 due to a discrepancy in Congressional Districts.
- 105: Precinct 105 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 105 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines was merged with Precinct 28 to the north to create new precinct shapes for both precincts.
- 111: Precinct 111 will be split north to south along the Dallas North Tollway forming a new precinct, Precinct 245. Precinct 245 will be located to the east of the split. The current Precinct 111 will remain to the west of the split.
- 119: Precinct 119 will be split west to east along Hearst Castle Way, then southeast along Breakers Ln., then east along Mount Vernon Way, then south on Marchman Way, then finally east on Caravan Dr. forming a new precinct, Precinct 246. Precinct 246 will be located to the south of the split. The current Precinct 119 will remain to the north of the split.
- 128: Precinct 128 will be split west to southeast along the natural boundary of White Rock Creek to East Lucas Rd. forming a new precinct, Precinct 247. Precinct 247 will be located to the north and east of the split. The current Precinct 128 will remain to the south and west of the split.
- 134: Precinct 134 will be split west to east along Panther Creek Pkwy. (Frisco ISD and Prosper ISD boundary) forming a new precinct, Precinct 248. Precinct 248 will be located to the north of the split. The current Precinct 134 will remain

to the south of the split.

- 135: Precinct 135 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The area of Precinct 135 that was split by the proposed Congressional lines became a new precinct, Precinct 202. The "Precinct 202" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved. The new Precinct 202 could not be combined with Precinct 34 due to a discrepancy in Texas House Districts.
- 140: Precinct 140 contained a narrow strip of land that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. The narrow strip of land in Precinct 140 was dissolved into Precinct 206. Lines for both precincts were redrawn, creating new precinct shapes for Precinct 140 and Precinct 206.
- 148: Precinct 148 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 148 was able to be merged with Precinct 100. The "Precinct 148" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 150: A small strip of land in newly created split Precinct 200 (renamed from Precinct 253) was split by Texas House District lines in proposed Texas House District Plan H2316. The area of Precinct 200 that was split by the proposed Texas House lines was dissolved into Precinct 150. Lines for both precincts were redrawn, creating new precinct shapes for Precinct 150 and Precinct 200.
- 153: Precinct 153 will be split west to east along the Wylie and Sachse city boundary forming a new precinct, Precinct 249. Precinct 249 will be located to the north of the split. The current Precinct 153 will remain to the south of the split.
- 158: Precinct 158 was split by Congressional lines in proposed Congressional Plan C2193. The areas of Precinct 158 that were split by the proposed Congressional lines were merged with Precinct 106 to the northeast and Precinct 141 to the southeast to create new precinct shapes for all three precincts.
- 163: Precinct 163 will be split west to east along Virginia Pkwy (splitting zip codes 75071 and 75072) forming a new precinct, Precinct 250. Precinct 250 will be located to the north of the split. The current Precinct 163 will remain to the south of the split.
- 171: Precinct 171 will be split north to south along N. Watters Rd. (from W. Exchange Pkwy. To W. McDermott Dr.) forming a new precinct, Precinct 251. Precinct 251 will be located to the west of the split. The current Precinct 171 will remain to the east of the split.
- 177: Precinct 177 will be split north to south along the Dallas North Tollway forming a new precinct, Precinct 252. Precinct 252 will be located to the east of the split. The current Precinct 177 will remain to the west of the split.
- 180: Precinct 180 was a precinct with that was created out of necessity during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 180 was able to be merged with Precinct 172. The "Precinct 180" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 182: Precinct 182 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 182 was able to be merged with Precinct 172. The "Precinct 182" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 184: Precinct 184 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 184 was able to be merged with Precinct 188. The "Precinct 184" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 200: Precinct 200 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 200 was able to be merged with Precinct 193. The "Precinct 200" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 200: A small strip of land in newly created split Precinct 200 (renamed from Precinct 253) was split by Texas House District lines in proposed Texas House District Plan H2316. The area of Precinct 200 that was split by the proposed Texas House lines was dissolved into Precinct 150. Lines for both precincts were redrawn, creating new precinct shapes for Precinct 150 and Precinct 200.
- 201: Precinct 201 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 201 was able to be merged with Precinct 189. The "Precinct 201" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 202: Precinct 202 was a precinct with zero voters that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. Because of newly redrawn district lines, Precinct 202 was able to be merged with Precinct 172. The "Precinct 202" name will be recycled to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County.
- 216: Precinct 216 will be split southwest to northeast along State Highway 121 forming a new precinct, Precinct 253. Precinct 253 will be located to the southeast of the split. The current Precinct 216 will remain to the northwest of the split.
- 220: Precinct 220 contained a small area of land that was created during a previous redistricting in Collin County. The area of land in Precinct 220 was dissolved into Precinct 209. Lines for both precincts were redrawn, creating new precinct shapes for Precinct 209 and Precinct 220.

- 249: Precinct 249 was a newly created precinct that was a result of splitting Precinct 153 in Phase 1. Precinct 249 was renamed to Precinct 148 to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County. The "Precinct 148" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved.
- 250: Precinct 250 was a newly created precinct that was a result of splitting Precinct 163 in Phase 1. Precinct 250 was renamed to Precinct 180 to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County. The "Precinct 180" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved.
- 251: Precinct 251 was a newly created precinct that was a result of splitting Precinct 171 in Phase 1. Precinct 251 was renamed to Precinct 182 to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County. The "Precinct 182" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved.
- 252: Precinct 252 was a newly created precinct that was a result of splitting Precinct 177 in Phase 1. Precinct 252 was renamed to Precinct 184 to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County. The "Precinct 184" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved.
- 253: Precinct 253 was a newly created precinct that was a result of splitting Precinct 216 in Phase 1. Precinct 253 was renamed to Precinct 200 to maintain consecutive precinct numbering in Collin County. The "Precinct 200" name was recycled from a precinct that was dissolved.
