- D. To motivate participants to exhibit positive behaviors by assisting in re-establishing control of their lives.

ABOUT S.C.O.R.E.

Our S.C.O.R.E program, run jointly by the Collin County Sheriff's Office and Collin County CSCD, is a state-funded Intermediate Sanction Facility. It is an in-custody facility that offers treatment alternatives for medium to high-risk felony/misdemeanor offenders who are facing probation revocations or incarceration. Our program is designed to help defendants with cognitive behavioral change (better decision making), developing work ethic, and promoting a structured lifestyle. All programs offered in our S.C.O.R.E. program are based on evidence-based practices.

DAILY ACTIVITIES

From the first day of admission into the program, we educate the S.C.O.R.E. participants to be more responsible. To provide a structured environment and teach work ethic, we provide the following daily schedule:

- 4:30 am** – Wake up
 - 5:00-6:00 am** – Breakfast
 - 7:00 am** – Work (in the community or on-site)
 - 11:30 am** – Back in CCF/Break
 - 12:30 pm** – Lunch
 - 1:30 pm** – Treatment/Education/Groups
 - 6:30 pm** – Dinner
 - 7:00-10:00 pm** – Free Time/TV/Games
 - 7:30 pm** - AA Meeting (Thursday/Sunday)
 - 10:30 pm** – Lights Out
- *Weekend and Holiday schedules are subject to change.*

Visitation Hours

Visitation hours are based on bunk assignment.



S.C.O.R.E. felony participation is up to 24 months. Misdemeanor participation: Class A is up to 1 year; Class B is up to 180 days.

ELIGIBILITY FOR S.C.O.R.E.

- Both Felony and Misdemeanor cases eligible.
- Non-Violent Offenses (please call for pre-authorization)
- Age 17 and Older
- No Sexual Offenses
- Physically Capable of Working (less physically demanding work is available)
- Complete Classification Evaluation

S.C.O.R.E. FACT SHEET

- YOU WILL BE INCARCERATED IN THE COLLIN COUNTY MINIMUM SECURITY FACILITY AT 4800 COMMUNITY BLVD IN MCKINNEY AND WILL ONLY BE RELEASED BY COURT ORDER.
- YOU WILL CHECK IN AT THE COLLIN COUNTY JAIL AT 4300 COMMUNITY BLVD IN MCKINNEY AND BE TRANSPORTED TO THE MINIMUM SECURITY FACILITY AFTER JAIL PROCESSING.
- JAIL PROCESSING TIMES VARY. IF YOU HAVE TO DETOX, HAVE MEDICAL ISSUES, OR HAVE HOLDS/WARRANTS/NEW OFFENSES, YOUR TRANSPORT TO SCORE MAY BE DELAYED FOR A LONGER PERIOD. YOUR TIME IN THE PROGRAM DOES NOT BEGIN UNTIL YOU ARE TRANSPORTED TO THE MINIMUM SECURITY FACILITY.
- YOUR LENGTH OF TIME IN THE PROGRAM IS BASED UPON YOUR PROGRESS. YOUR RELEASE FROM THE PROGRAM WILL BE DETERMINED BY YOUR TREATMENT TEAM AND CSCD.
- MALES: YOUR HOUSING CONSISTS OF A POD OF ALL MALES IN THE SCORE PROGRAM.
- FEMALES: YOUR HOUSING CONSISTS OF A POD WITH A MIXTURE OF GENERAL POPULATION FEMALES, WORK RELEASE FEMALES, AND FEMALES IN THE SCORE PROGRAM.
- IF YOU ARE TAKING MEDICATION AND WANT TO CONTINUE TAKING MEDICATION WHILE IN THE SCORE PROGRAM, PLEASE CONTACT THE JAIL MEDICAL STAFF AT 972-547-5200 FOR INFORMATION.
